

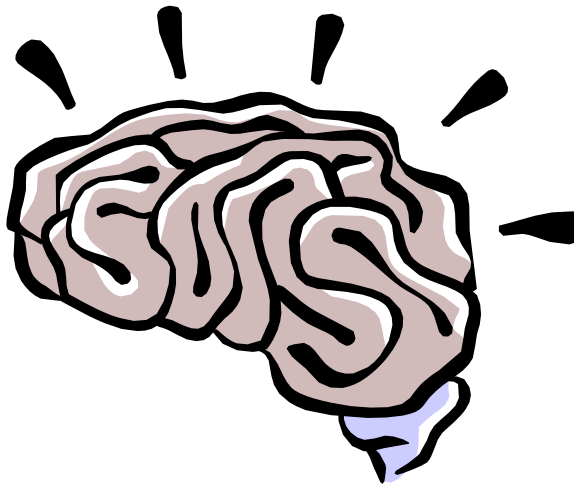

Discover Nursing

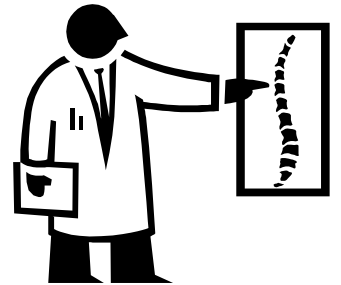
